

- 2. Attend <u>career</u> <u>fairs</u> or workplace tours that can help you learn more.
- 3. Learn more about work-based learning experiences.
- 4. Ask about credential and certificate opportunities you can earn while in high school.
- 5. Consider pursuing an internship. These are offered for a variety of industries.
