- Roper: start of the year has been great, went back to her roots and helped in preschool. It's been all hands on deck and everyone has pitched in and worked together beautifully. Employees all jumped right in--be in handing out materials in 100 degree weather in the parking lot or teaching a class--everyone did what was needed. We had 2 parent give-away days which went well and we will be doing that again next month. We also purchased additional teach-town licences. We are open to any feedback that parents have. We know this is anxiety producing for everyone.
- Huebner: It has been as smooth as it could be for the first week, but it's been an incredible amount of work. Most of the 12k IEP's are completed. We are working to make sure all the SPED teams have the proper safety equipment for in person learning. Being in a preschool classroom was a great reminder as well and we had a lot of fun. It was difficult to navigate the students and the PPE--those students move fast. Over 400 families signed up to receive manipulatives so when they are at home they will have the same materials they see on the screen. Technology is really hard to get right now--laptops with touch screens.
