

# PWCS Summer Reading

## Grades K-2

### This summer, you get to choose what you read!

1. Review the options on the choice board.
2. Select a book that fits the chosen option. You may pick a print book, eBook, or audiobook.
3. Read actively - think about ideas, characters, themes, and perspectives as you read.

### A few helpful hints:

- Choose a book that challenges you but still feels interesting.
- Try something new - summer is a great time to explore different genres, topics, or voices.
- If you need help finding a book, ask a librarian at the Prince William Public Library. They are happy to help you find a great book.

Draw yourself exploring something you notice.</p>	<p><b>Read a book about a family or community.</b> How do the people in the story care for one another?</p>	<p><b>Read a nonfiction book about an animal.</b> What does the animal eat and how do you know? (Look for clues in the book.)</p>	<p><b>Read a book about an American Symbol.</b> What does the symbol stand for? Draw the symbol.</p> 	<p><b>Read a book about plants.</b> What is one thing a plant needs to live? How do you know?</p>
<p><b>Read a book about a tradition, celebration, or special day.</b> Why is that tradition important to the people in the story? Is there something your family celebrates too?</p>	<p><b>Read a book about a famous American.</b> Why do people remember this person?</p>	<p><b>Read a book with something to count.</b> Practice counting the items, then try counting something around your home.</p>	<p><b>Read a book where food, clothing, music, or art is important to the story.</b> Why do you think this food, clothing, or art matters in the story?</p>	<p><b>Read a book about a Native American person or tribe.</b> What is one interesting idea or tradition you learned?</p>
<p><b>Read a book that describes an animal's habitat.</b> What does the habitat look like? Draw what you see.</p>	<p><b>Read a book where a character goes on an adventure.</b> What adventure would you like to go on someday?</p>		<p><b>Read a book with a character who goes to school.</b> What are you excited to learn next school year?</p>	<p><b>Read a book set in your favorite season.</b> What is something in the book that you wish you could try?</p>
<p><b>Read a book about a plant or animal that is new to you.</b> Teach someone what you learned.</p>	<p><b>Read a book or article about making something with recycled materials.</b> Try it yourself or draw your design.</p>	<p><b>Read a nonfiction book about the sun or moon.</b> Draw a picture outside (sidewalk, chalk, or paper) to show something you learned.</p>	<p><b>Read a book about a scientist or inventor.</b> What problem did they solve? Try creating something new like they did.</p>	<p><b>Read a book about kindness.</b> What is one kind thing you can do today? Do it!</p>
<p><b>Read a book about a famous athlete, entertainer, or artist.</b> What is one fact you learned about their life or talent?</p>	<p><b>Read a book about friends.</b> What is one way you can be a good friend?</p>	<p><b>Read a folk tale or fairy tale.</b> Can you retell the story in your own words or pictures?</p>	<p><b>Read a book with your favorite character.</b> What do you like about them? What makes them interesting to you?</p>	<p><b>Find a book with an interesting cover.</b> What do you predict will happen? Read to see if your prediction was right.</p>
