2025-2026 School Profile

Osborn Park High School is one of thirteen high schools located in suburban Prince William County, part of the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area. Serving the central portion of the county, the school is situated between the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. The surrounding community includes residents from diverse backgrounds, including business professionals, government employees, and military families.

Osborn Park offers a wide range of rigorous academic courses and career-focused vocational programs. The school serves approximately 2,590 students in grades 9 through 12. Designated as *The Biotechnology & Engineering Center*, Osborn Park also hosts six specialized programs: NJROTC, Automotive Technology, Project Lead the Way Biomedical Sciences and Engineering, the Pre-Governor's School Program, and Licensed Practical Nursing.

Osborn Park is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Definition of Curriculum

Prince William County Public Schools provides a range of courses from remedial levels to advanced placement, dual enrollment, and those meeting requirements for standard or advanced studies diplomas. Both vocational and academic courses are available, allowing students to prepare for college, enter the workforce after graduation, or pursue post-secondary training in various fields.

Specialty Programs

Osborn Park has been designated as The Biotechnology & Engineering Center and houses six other unique programs: NJROTC, Automotive Technology, Project Lead the Way Biomedical Sciences and Engineering, Pre-Governor's School Program, and Licensing Practical Nursing.

Class Percentile

All courses with Carnegie units of credit are used to compute GPA and percentile, shown on student transcripts. Starting with the class of 2022, PWCS reports class percentile instead of class rank. Courses are not evaluated on a pass/fail basis. Transcripts from other districts with pass/fail grades won't affect GPA and percentile unless a corresponding letter grade is provided. All students earning an Advanced Studies or Standard diploma are included in the senior class percentile.

Seven Period A/B Schedule

Osborn Park uses a 7-period schedule, with students attending seven 92-minute classes on alternating days. This schedule allows students the opportunity to earn up to seven credits each school year.

These courses adhere to stringent requirements prescribed by the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) and are awarded grade point values based upon a 5.0 scale.
